QSV - 1	Theater - General Questions	Why is the Government projecting the APS-5 contract award in the fourth quarter of fiscal year 16 (FY16) when proposals are due in late FY15?	This is a large, complex acquisition with significant competition for two sites. The Government's projected award date reflects the estimated time to execute the competition.
QSV - 2		Given the magnitude and complexity of this acquisition, will the Government consider allowing more than 30 days for submission of formal proposals?	To assist Offerors, the Government will issue a second draft RFP on or about 1 September 2015. Questions/comments to the second draft RFP are projected to be due by 16 September 2015. The Government will issue the formal RFP on or about 19 October 2015 with formal proposals due 18 November 2015. The Government has determined 30 days for submission of formal proposals is sufficient given the Government will have provided two draft RFPs.
QSV - 3		Will government consider putting in adjustable cost, e.g. cost of living adjustments (COLA)?	No.
QSV - 4		Will all compliant proposals be evaluated for Technical?	Yes, all compliant proposals will receive a technical evaluation and will be evaluated as Acceptable / Unacceptable.
QSV - 5		If the Government opens discussions, what is considered a highly rated proposal when in terms of the competitive range determination?	A proposal that does not require a major rewrite or portray a significant misunderstanding of the requirements could be deemed as highly rated proposal.
QSV - 6		Are all warehouses humidity controlled?	No. Warehouses that have rolling stock have humidity control. The Government is working towards having other warehouses be humidity controlled.
QSV - 7	Warehouse 219	How many warehouses does the APS-5 contractor manage?	The APS-5 contractor has access to and manages twelve (12) APS-5 dedicated warehouses plus five (5) additional warehouses for a total of seventeen (17) warehouses.
QSV - 8		Are all equipment stored covered in warehouses?	Currently there is some equipment stored outside. However, the goal is covered storage for all equipment. Equipment that is stored outside is mainly equipment that is not at 10/20 status and awaiting maintenance.
QSV - 9		What are the levels of services considered during 10/20 standard?	Levels of services are dependent on 10/20 standards in the technical manual (TM) and Care of Supplies in Storage/Stocks in Storage (COSIS) requirements.
QSV - 10		Are Basic Issue Items the only secondary items associated with the equipment?	Yes.
QSV - 11		Are vehicles and equipment (Patriot Launcher System) in WH 219 serviced on a regular basis?	Yes, based on the service requirements stated in the Patriot TM and AR 740-1 (COSIS) for said equipment.
QSV - 12		Please elaborate on being 100% APS authorized filled by FY15?	Department of the Army sets this priority. Reference the PWS and workload data provided in the RFP. Submit your proposal for the workload data provided in the RFP; do not make assumptions about the workload.

QSV - 13		When vehicles are due for services, how much moving of the vehicles have to be done?	Vehicles are arranged by when service is due; therefore minimal movement should be required to access vehicles requiring maintenance.
QSV - 14		Who sets services schedule?	This is a collaborative approach. The APS-5 Contractor is responsible to ensure service schedules are performed in accordance with the PWS to include applicable TMs. The Government at times will identify specific equipment as a priority; the contractor is responsible for determining the schedule to meet the Government's priorities.
QSV - 15	Warehouse 221	What issues do you currently have with the Inland Petroleum Distribution System (IPDS)?	They are Vietnam era equipment with parts difficult to obtain.
QSV - 16		Are MAC air tools available?	Yes. Air compressors.
QSV - 17		Where is the control office?	In the Maintenance building.
QSV - 18		Where are the STAMIS and network connections located?	In the control office.
QSV - 19		Sustainment systems interconnected?	Yes. Neither GCCS-A or SAMS-E is used. Currently using AWRDS.
QSV - 20		Are Technical Manual Libraries available?	Yes. Analog and digital electronic technical manuals (ETMs) are available.
QSV - 21		Who orders parts for tenant units?	Tenant units are responsible for ordering their own parts.
QSV - 22		Is maintenance provided to tenant units?	Yes. The APS 5 contractor inspects vehicles and provides a list of required parts to the tenant. The tenant is responsible for ordering the required parts and supplying the parts to maintenance yard for the APS 5 contractor to make repairs.
QSV - 23		Who runs the SSA?	Area Support Group - Qatar
QSV - 24		Management of paperwork is prepared by who, e.g. work orders?	Managed by the tenants.
QSV - 25	Building 307	Are all facilities maintained by DPW?	Yes.
QSV - 26		How does C maintenance status work (vehicles waiting parts)?	The vehicle remains awaiting parts and is not inducted into COSIS until it is 10/20 standard.
QSV - 27		Are parts on a long wait list, e.g. one year ordered parts.	Parts are normally received within 30 days; however some parts have longer lead times.
QSV - 28		Do you need a CAC card to log into AWRDS?	Yes.
QSV - 29		Where are communications equipment stored?	Communications equipment is stored at another location in the maintenance yard.
QSV - 30		Who is responsible for calibration and test, measurement, and diagnostics equipment (TMDE)?	It is responsibility of the APS-5 contractor to coordinate for APS-5 GFE with the TMDE lab as outlined in the PWS.
QSV - 31		Where is the TMDE lab located?	Camp Arifjan, Kuwait.
QSV - 32		Who is responsible for submitting facility work orders?	The APS-5 contractor submits facility work orders to DPW.
QSV - 33		Does the U.S Government perform Quality Assurance maintenance?	Yes.

QSV - 34		Who decides when a vehicle comes out of the warehouse for maintenance?	The service schedule in the applicable technical manuals dictates when the APS-5 contractor will perform service. If service cannot be verified, service is done as soon as possible and put into COSIS.
QSV - 35		Who manages the maintenance system?	The APS 5 contractor.
QSV - 36		Where is weapons maintenance conducted?	Weapons maintenance is conducted in the arms room.
QSV - 37	Warehouse 415	How many lines of authorize stockage list (ASL) are there?	Up to 25,000 lines for COSIS and GFE.
QSV - 38		Are parts in Warehouse 415 for COSIS or tenant units?	The parts in Warehouse 415 are for COSIS. However, the Commander can give authorization for tenant units parts on a case by case basis.
QSV - 39		Are AWRDS work centers located in work area?	Yes.
QSV - 40		Do you maintain major assemblies; conduct depot level work.	The APS-5 contractor maintains major assemblies. The APS-5 performs replacement repair services of major assemblies but does not perform jobs that would require rebuild work, i.e. depot level work.
QSV - 41		Who manages the Central Receiving and Shipment Point (CRSP)?	ASG Qatar is responsible for the CRSP. The APS-5 contractor packs and transports equipment to the CRSP as required.
QSV - 42		Is there equipment containerized for deployment?	Yes.
QSV - 43		How often does the Accountable Officer rotate out?	Generally once a year there is a change in the Accountability Officer. With a change in the Accountability Officer, the APS-5 contractor is responsible to conduct a 100% inventory within 30 days.
QSV - 44		Who is responsible for inventory adjustment reports?	The APS-5 contractor is responsible for inventory adjustments reports and provides the inventory adjustment reports to the Accountable Officer for signature.
QSV - 45		Are regular meetings in supply conducted with the APS-5 contractor?	Yes. Weekly.
QSV - 46		Does APS-5 use Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) interrogators to bring to record received parts?	Yes.
QSV - 47	Warehouse 410	Are packing crates built by the APS-5 contractor?	Yes. Some packing crates are built by the APS-5 contractor.
QSV - 48		Does air delivery come in packed and ready to go?	Yes. However, if air deliveries are damaged, it's the APS-5 contractor's responsibility to repackage them.
QSV - 49		When are inventories done?	10% cyclic and sensitive items monthly. 100% inventories during change of Accountable Officer.
QSV - 50		Does equipment or parts in this warehouse get used?	Yes, we do see movement on certain items.
QSV - 51		What type of sensitive items are in the cage?	Radio sets and CL VII items
QSV - 52	Arms Room	Are small arms primarily stored in the arms storage room?	Weapons stored in the arms room include APS crew service weapons and weapons for individual tenant units.
QSV - 53		Where are the bench stock items stored?	Warehouse 410.
QSV - 54		Do tenant units order their own parts and bring it to the arms room for maintenance?	Yes.
QSV - 55	Warehouse 210	Who is the Senior Commander of Camp As Sayliyah (CAS)?	The CAS Senior Commander is an O-6 in ASG Qatar.

QSV - 56		When equipment leaves CAS, where does it go?	AL Udeid Air Base (AUAB) or port.
QSV - 57		Is Warehouse 210 equipment taken out for exercises?	No.
QSV - 58		Do foreign governments utilize items stocked at APS-5?	There are some foreign governments that use the items as specified by the Department of Defense.
QSV - 59		Do all actions happen through the Material Maintenance Center (MMC)?	The MMC processes equipment coming and all dispositions for outbound equipment. MMC is responsible for inventories.
QSV - 60	Falcon 78	If personnel were required to man Falcon 78, who would maintain it?	Falcon 78 is manned by a tenant unit 24 hours a day.
QSV - 61	Q&A Session	Are there other office spaces in warehouses that were not shown?	Yes, in the supply area.
QSV - 62		What is the process for patriot maintenance?	The APS-5 contractor is required to perform maintenance in accordance with a 90 day cycle or as directed by the Government. Maintenance does not include insertion of the actual missile. The APS-5 contractor is responsible only for the 90 day service; the APS-5 contractor's responsibility ceases once patriot unit has equipment in hand. The contractor shall be available if the unit needs them for technical advice. The contractor is responsible for historical records.
QSV - 63		Where are non-categorized equipment located, e.g. Blue Force Trackers (BFTs)?	Qatar currently does not have any non-cataloged equipment and therefore this does not apply to the Qatar site.
QSV - 64		What is the relationship between MMC and how is it tied with Brigade?	The MMC's main function is to print off Material Release Orders (MROs) and provide them to the Transportation Division. The MMC works with the Accountable Officer. The Accountable Officer communicates with Brigade.
QSV - 65		In RFP, not all key positions have not been identified. Will the Government provide a list of all key personnel?	The government updated the technical exhibit by providing all government-required key and specified non-key positions. Offerors must ensure a complete staffing solution is proposed as indicated in Sections L and M. Also, as indicated, the government's workload data, minimum FLC1 hours also may not be a complete staffing solution and offeror's must ensure all requirements of the RFP are met and it's unique approach is complete.
QSV - 66		Will questions be answered prior to release of formal RFP?	Yes. The Government will post relevant questions and answers from both the site visit and questions submitted outside site visit to the EAGLE website.
