

**BOA Holder Meeting Question and Answers
May 20, 2013**

Category	QUESTION	ANSWER
BOA Administration	When is the 4th Domain (Plans & Operations) going to be announced?	The EAGLE requirements do not include plans and operations as a separate requirement.
BOA Administration	Will this presentation and the attendance roster be emailed to BOA Holders?	The presentation slides and Q&As will be posted to the EAGLE website. The Government will also post a list of the BOA Holders who were represented at the BOA Holder Meeting, but an individual attendance roster will not be provided.
BOA Administration	Is there a place that lists all 112 BOA Holders with the complete team members?	No, the EAGLE Website provides a list of all BOA Holders, however, a list with the BOA Holders and teammates will not be provided.
BOA Administration	DCAA Audits - You had an Audit conducted on our company. We received draft results from DCAA but they have indicated you must provide us with a final approved copy. When can I expect to receive a copy?	A final approved audit can be received upon request by the contractor to the contracting office.
BOA Administration	Why is keeping the EAGLE office aware of our business size important? We were under the impression that this [is] only important at the solicitation response level for specific contracts. Isn't this take care of under the Certs & Reps for each solicitation?	Business size is important on the Basic Ordering Agreement (BOA) instrument in addition to the Task Order Request for Proposals (RFPS). While Offerors need to provide their Certs & Reps for each Task Order solicitation, it is equally important they provide updated business size information that is relevant to their executed BOA.
BOA Administration	Regarding Prime/Sub novations, it is implied we can change when we want rather than [during] annual change? And also that this is less formal? Please explain.	<p>Novations as a result of FAR 42.1204 - Applicability of Novation Agreements, still require formal processing as outlined in the FAR; however, these will be processed on a case-by-case basis either during or outside of the annual opening as appropriate.</p> <p>For those situations where the change is in name only, the process requirements at FAR 42.1205 -- Agreement to Recognize Contractors Change of Name, applies to the BOA Holder's executed BOA instrument and may be processed at any time.</p> <p>For occurrences where a BOA Holder's BOA Attachment 0002 teammate had a change-in-name-only, an e-mail should be sent to the BOA admin address. This email should provide the BOA Holder's name, BOA #, the affected teammate's current name and CAGE, as well as the affected teammate's new name and CAGE (note, a CAGE should not have changed as the result of a change-in-name-only action).</p>
BOA Administration	If you have 10 original teammates and add 2 more during the additions process, do you need a technical evaluation on the two additional?	No, only the past performance is evaluated on the two additions.
BOA Administration	During the revision phase, can you drop or add? What about during the addition phase?	During the revision process, you may drop or add up to 10 base teammates to show capability. You may also replace a team member with a new team member. However, when revising your organizational capability team structure, please be aware that a technical review of the changes will be performed. All changes to the organizational capability team must be considered acceptable technically and past performance reviewed before the Government will approve the change. During the addition process, you may add teammates to enhance your capability but you must already have those organizational capabilities in your base of 10 teammates.
BOA Administration	So, is it limited to 10 teammates or 10 Past Performances?	You are limited to 10 base teammates and each one must have a reference. Attachment 0002 has been modified to allow for additional teammates during the addition process.

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BOA Administration	Which attachment is for the teammate list?	The teammate list for a companies Basic Ordering Agreement (BOA) is BOA Attachment 0002 - Team Arrangment.
Communications	The website has been helpful in communicating cursory EAGLE related information, however, it would be more beneficial if all documents and more detailed information is provided including Incumbent information, Union specifics, etc. Will the Gov't include more background information on the website?	Yes, when it is feasible, we will include more information on the website.
Communications	Would the Government consider providing an award/EN schedule on the EAGLE website following submission of Offeror proposals. This would help to keep Offerors updated on evaluation progress and limit the calls to the contracting office for status.	Offerors who propose on a specific Task Order RFP are contacted as appropriate when an exchange is to take place. This is true for clarifications, communications, and discussions. Regarding Evaluation Notices (EN's), these are Offeror specific so a website approach is not feasible. A similar situation would apply to the BOA process as well.
Communications	What mechanisms are in place to direct the Government to this vehicle?	Other Army organizations are briefed on the EAGLE program up through the General Officer level on a continual basis. In addition, this office and the ASC EAGLE Business Office are contacted on a continual basis from other Army organizations requesting information on EAGLE.
Communications	What process should we follow to introduce the Government to this vehicle?	If a Government customer is interested in their requirement falling under EAGLE, they should contact the ASC EAGLE Business Office to inquire about the possiblity of their requirement falling under an EAGLE task order. .
Small Business	The APS-5 TO had no requirement for the utilization of Small Business. (1) Will the lack of a small business utilization requirement be true for all OCONUS TOs?	Each Task Order RFP stands alone and will contain its own terms and conditions. FAR Part 19 does not apply to OCONUS requirements. However, the Government will review each requirement for socioeconomic opportunities and include small business participation where feasible.
Small Business	Are large business exempt from their BOA Small Business Plan for OCONUS work?	Each Task Order RFP stands alone and will contain its own terms and conditions. Therefore, if a Small Business Plan is required, it will be listed in the terms and conditions of the RFP.
Small Business	What has been the Government's experience so far on challenges by small business to convert unrestricted task orders to a small business TO using the "rule of 2"?	Since no EAGLE Task Orders have been awarded to date, there are no experiences to glean from thus far.
Small Business	Are small business plans meeting goals?	Since no EAGLE Task Orders have been awarded to date, there have been no opportunities to measure goal achievement.
Small Business	Joint Ventures established for the purposes of competing and executing work under the EAGLE Program, have no historical Small Business Participation (SBP) experience. Please advise as to how that will be evaluated during the source selection process.	A neutral rating will be assigned.
Small Business	With several installation bids under the 35.5m annual threshold coming out unrestricted/F&O, what is the new analysis decision criteria for allocating a bid restricted to SB?	The \$35.5m threshold has not changed. In determining the estimated value of the Task Order, the Government determines the average annual amount for the base period and any option periods. If the estimated value of the consolidated Installation Logistics Annual Requirements are more than \$1M but less than or equal to \$35.5M it will be set aside for small business. If the estimated average annual requirement exceeds \$35.5M, the Government will apply the "Rule of 2" to determine whether the requirement will be solicited as a small business set-aside or on an unrestricted basis (see BOA Holder Meeting Slide # 27).

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Small Business	Can the Government address why there is no Small Business requirement associated with the APS-5 Kuwait Task Order?	Each Task Order RFP stands alone and will contain its own terms and conditions. FAR Part 19 does not apply to OCONUS requirements. However, the Government will review each requirement for socioeconomic opportunities and include small business participation where feasible.
Small Business	If an 8a BOA Holder graduates from an 8a can they still pursue an 8a Set Aside Task Order?	Yes, if they were an 8a before the Task Order Solicitation closed.
Small Business	Is it the annual revenue of small business threshold that must be \$35.5M dollar threshold for a Task Order for a Small Business Set Aside, or is it a Small Business standard guideline rolling 3 year average of \$35.5M to qualify for the Small Business goal?	It is using an average of 3 years
Small Business	How do you distinguish if a BOA will be set aside for an 8a or Small Business?	We take it you mean a Task Order requirement. This is based upon EAGLE consolidations. If it is currently being performed by an 8a, it will be competed as an 8a. If it is an 8a, it will stay an 8a. If it was not performed previously by an 8(a) and it is under the \$35.5M threshold it will be set aside for Small Business.
Step 3	Can the Government advise when task orders that have been in Source Selection might be awarded?	Task Order status will provided at the APBI briefing.
Step 3	In order to adequately prepare for a contract win/transition, when does the government anticipate making an award? Request the government publish an estimated award schedule like the estimate RFP release list.	At this time, the Government is not anticipating publishing an award schedule. It is estimated that the first EAGLE task order awards will occur prior to the end of this fiscal year.
Step 3	The question cut off period of 10 days prior to submission has resulted in the Gov't having to extend proposal turn in dates. We have recommended that the first round of questions be due NLT 10 days after RFP release which will allow the Government more time to respond to the questions and adjust the RFP accordingly without having to extend. Will the Government revise the question and response schedule to reduce RFP schedule delays?	The Government does not intend to revise the schedule for the submission of Questions. The schedule was established so the site visit can be conducted and questions can be submitted after the site visit.
Step 3	Joint Ventures established for the purposes of competing and executing work under the EAGLE Program may utilize the corporate business systems (e.g., Cost Accounting System, Purchasing, Property Management, etc.) of the Managing Partner. Please advise as to how this will be evaluated during in the source selection process.	The offeror's proposal shall follow the terms and conditions of its Joint Venture agreement. In addition, its proposal shall clearly state what corporate business systems are being proposed for the performance of the proposed task order contract. For example, if the JV does not have its own established Corporate Business systems, which of the JV partners systems will it be using in performance of the contract. The proposal will be evaluated accordingly.
Step 3	If the prime is not identified as self sufficient - Clarify what condition I can invite a subcontractor to perform work with me on a BOA. What if I already have an approved teammate that meets the socioeconomic goal?	You can invite a subcontractor that is not on the approved teammate list to meet a socioeconomic goal in an Unrestricted task order procurement only.
Step 3	If we didn't demonstrate that we meet the functional areas, how can I submit myself as a contractor to perform the work?	During the task order level, contractors must demonstrate their capability to meet requirements of the RFP. The prime can make a business decision to propose themselves or their teammates. There may be instances when the prime expanded their capacity/capability, hired more people, etc and are not able to perform the work themselves. If teammates are proposed, the Government will verify that the teammate is listed in the Attachment 0002, Team Arrangement

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Step 3	Can you give an estimated date for planning purposes for contractors for upcoming RFPs/Task Orders? Currently, the EAGLE Website only shows up to September 2013.	Unfortunately, we cannot provide any more information at this time. When possible, we will provide dates for upcoming RFPs/Task Orders.
Step 3	If a company wins a Task Order, and future logistics requirements arise that are not on the original RFP, does that company automatically get those requirements?	Yes, that is correct. If a very large requirement arises, we can elect not to exercise that option and re-compete. Bear in mind that some installations have requirements that would normally fall under EAGLE, but are done by other services (i.e., Navy). In these situations they would not automatically fall under EAGLE - such as in the case for the requirements at Joint Base Langley Eustis (JBLE) and Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek Story (JBLCS).
Step 3	When is the first award coming out from this program?	The first award is anticipated prior to the end of the Fiscal Year.
Step 3	Have you considered a draft RFP or L&M be released to the contractor?	When its feasible we will be issuing draft RFPs for industry review.
Step 3	The deadline for proposals constantly changes, we have been told we submitted a question too late only to have the deadline for proposals extended a day later, why do we not get our question answered then?	Questions received prior to closing will be answered as best as possible. Duplicate questions will not be answered. If the RFP closing date is extended, it does not affect the deadline for submission of questions. Only if the RFP close is extended within 10 days of the original RFP close date will we re-open for questions if a decision is made to do so. We strive to answer all questions unless it is a duplicate, that is why it is important you search through the Q&As to see if your question is answered. Your question may not have exactly the same wording but it may be seeking the same answer as another question posted.
Step 3	RFP Draft - will you release one?	When its feasible we will be issuing draft RFPs for industry review.
Step 3	If we got staffing and staffing/labor mix, then we wouldn't have to worry about the workload data.	We are not considering providing the staffing/labor mix at this time.
Step 3	What is trade off?	The trade off evaluation is explained in the task order RFP. A confidence interval is developed in evaluating the past performance rating. The Past Performance Factor is significantly more important than Cost/Price Factor. The Cost/Price Factor is more important than Small Business Participation. There is no tradeoff on technical.
Step 3	Is there a general weighting between Step 2 & Step 3?	Step 2 is rated acceptable or unacceptable. Step 3 is rated using a confidence rating scale. These are independent evaluations done at each step. In Step 3 only the proposed teammates and subs are evaluated, not the entire Step 2 BOA team.
Step 3	What is the criteria used for weighting price and past performance?	The Government will make a best value determination that is specific to each individual task order.
Step 3	Will the Government consider expanding to more than one additional reference for Past Performance BOA Step 3?	The Government may consider expanding this requirement.
Step 3	Can talk about criteria for highest competitive rating - how is performance criteria established?	The Government will make a best value determination that is specific to each individual task order.
Step 3	Is there a situation where the incumbent is exempt from submission of inventory?	We would look at each scenario, but generally the incumbent would be required to submit the information.
Step 3	Can we have more specifics about each opportunity? As an example, if there is a CBA - who are the incumbents?	The incumbent contractor & contract number are provided in Section A of the RFP. CBA information, when applicable, will be provided with draft PWS and workload data for industry review when feasible.

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Step 3	This agreement states you may require Secret Clearance. Will you complete a DD254 Block 9 for EAGLE? If we don't maintain this our clearance can take 1 year to re-instate (so we've been told). This would limit your competition.	Facility clearances are determined at an installation level. Applying a DD254 on the BOA level for the EAGLE program is not a feasible approach to providing applicable security guidance.
Step 3	Can I propose myself if I've been approved for only one organizational capability?	See Briefing slide #21
Step 3	Do you have to use an approved teammate?	An Offeror, small or large, may propose multiple subcontractors in Step Two that possess similar capabilities. If the Offeror's approach is considered acceptable in Step Two, the Offeror will receive an executed BOA. When the Offeror submits a proposal in Step Three, it must propose the use of an approved subcontractor. Offerors, small and large, will determine which approved subcontractor it will use in Step Three. Offerors are NOT required to propose ALL subcontractors approved during Step Two. However, if they do propose the use of subcontractors, it MUST use its approved team members as listed in its BOA.
Step 3	Someone who is adept in Maintenance, Supply, and Transportation and the prime meets Scenario 3 (Slide 17) but wants to use a subcontractor because of pricing concerns, is that an option?	In scenario 3, the BOA Holder did not demonstrate organizational capability without the reliance of teammates in ALL functional areas. Therefore, when submitting a proposal in Step 3, the BOA Holder may only propose itself and/or the approved teammates for ALL functional areas. The exception is to meet socioeconomic goals. There is not an exception for pricing concerns
Step 3	If you extend date for proposals, doesn't it extend date for questions if it changed information contained in the Amendment?	Any information changed or if the due date is changed would be identified in the applicable amendment. An amendment does not necessarily extend the date for questions, unless the amendment specifically provides for an extended date for the Government to receive questions. Questions often have a different due date than proposals. If the question deadline has been extended, the amendment will indicate the new due date.
Step 3	The site visit and workload data are tightly intertwined together, it is nice to know how many feet each building is apart and to get the square footage but just driving by a building on a site visit doesn't do me a lot of good without good workload data to form my proposal. How are you going to improve the workload data?	Workload data is the best that is available at the time PPI is put together. The site visit supplements the workload data by giving you a sense of the "lay of the land" to provide more understanding of what it will take to fulfill the requirement. The Government is taking steps to improve workload data on future requirements.
Step 3	Clarify the evaluation method. i.e. Best Value, LPTA, Trade Off	The technical is evaluated acceptable/unacceptable, then we evaluate cost, past performance, and on unrestricted task orders, small business participation on a trade off basis.
Step 3	The mandatory minimum staffing that is in the RFP - is it the IGE?	The IGE is different. The IGE is used for personnel. The IGCE is used for costs. It is given to the PCO before solicitation issued. It is used to compare prices. It could have been what the past pricing was based on service contract act, reasonable G & A, overhead rates, etc. The IGE is filed with PCO based on minimum staffing.
Step 3	So the chart indicates references must be recent (within 5 years) - does that mean I will have to submit a new reference in Step 3?	Yes, if it is older than 5 years. Offeror's who lack recent contracts may be assigned a 'neutral' rating IAW FAR/DFARs/policy.
Step 3	Will the government continue evaluating the magnitude dollar value for provided references?	Yes, we will continue to evaluate references based on the magnitude and complexity criteria in the solicitation. Always look at Section M to determine the evaluation criteria.

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Step 3 - Past Performance	If the Prime submits themselves for a function they do not have past performance themselves, does that have the potential to lower your evaluation score for past performance?	Past Performance confidence ratings are assessed in the Step Three Task Order RFP process. It is possible that an Offeror's decision to propose themselves with no past performance history may affect their confidence rating.
Step 3 - Past Performance	Performance ratings - what is the performance ratings?	The performance ratings will be provided in each task order. The definitions that are provided are defined in the DoD Source Selection guide
Step 3 - Past Performance	How do we know what we have been rated?	You can request a debriefing to find out what you have been rated. Each Task Order stands on its own.
Step 3 - Past Performance	If a prime/sub rated gets a low rating, it would be good for the BOA Holder to know because it costs a large amount of money to attempt to go after a Task Order.	We look at the proposal, teammates, and subcontractors. We evaluate each reference and Task Order separately. During discussions or debriefings, primes will be informed of its past performance weaknesses.
Step 3 - Past Performance	PPIRS Rating - How is it being used?	PPIRS is used for both positive and negative past performance. No weighted score is given. The PPIRS rating assists us with determining an acceptable or an unacceptable rating (as performed in Step 2) - See BOA Holder Meeting Slide # 47, as well as a confidence rating in Step 3.
Step 3 - Past Performance	If subs or teammates are performing critical requirements, are they being evaluating past performance?	We removed language on critical requirements so only subs/teammates performing 20% or more of the work are evaluated.
Step 3 - Past Performance	If some references are provided in Step 2, they may be different dollar values than the requirements in Step 3. Why don't you ask for dollar values in Step 2?.	In the first and second BOA process, the Government did not request dollar values. As a result, the Government initiated the Past Performance data call with all the BOA Holders to obtain this information for those past performance references that were provided in the first and second BOA RFP proposals. Moving forward, the Government will be requesting dollar values for past performance references in the BOA Step 2 process.
Step 3 - Past Performance	For past participation, we used to submit a form 294 or 295. Based on subcontract value, which seems to contradict what is asked for by the government. The government asks for the total contract value.	The Government is requesting offerors report its subcontracting goals/participation against total contract value. The Government acknowledges that the information presented on your 294 and 295 isn't reported against total contract value, however, the forms do include a column where this information can be provided. Therefore, if an offeror chooses to submit a form 294 or 295 with its proposal, it will need to ensure that the 294/295 forms provided include the goals/% converted to show as a percentage against the total contract value for Government evaluation purposes. If an offeror only fills in the column for total subcontract value, then the Past Small Business Participation (Realism) portion of the offerors proposal will not be evaluated.
Step 3 - Pricing	What steps is the government taking to prevent low-ball bidders from winning awards?	When contracting on a cost-reimbursement basis, evaluations will include a cost realism analysis to determine whether the estimated proposed cost elements are realistic for the work to be performed, as required by FAR 15.305. As part of the cost evaluation, proposals are also reviewed to identify any Unbalanced Pricing. In accordance with FAR 15.404-1(g), Unbalanced Pricing, a proposal may be rejected if the Contracting Officer determines the lack of balance poses an unacceptable risk to the Government. In addition, the Firm Fixed Price Proposals will be evaluated using price analysis IAW FAR 15.404-1, Proposal Analysis Techniques.
Step 3 - Pricing	Should the subcontractors submit an attachment 5?	Attachment 0005 is a summary of the cost that the prime contractor is required to submit. However, all subcontractors need to submit the required cost information per the solicitation requirements.

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Step 3 - Pricing	In order to simplify the review process for the Army, would the Army consider putting together a template to standardize pricing, so that there is consistency through source selection?	Please follow FAR Table 15-2 for the standard requirements for pricing proposals.
Step 3 - Pricing	Transition Plan - how do you compare nonincumbent versus incumbent plan and costs?	Each offeror is responsible for proposing an acceptable approach to Transition-In. Each proposal is independently evaluated in accordance with the solicitation evaluation criteria.
Step 3 - Pricing	We have some concerns with attachment 0005 autopopulating when our subs complete it.	It was intended for primes to complete, not subs. Subs only submit summaries.
Step 3 - Technical	The EAGLE website has the estimated release dates for upcoming solicitations. For planning purposes it would be helpful to have a bit of pre-solicitation information before it comes out. Such as, but not limited to, the PWS, incumbent, and contract number. Is this a possibility for future solicitation releases?	The EAGLE contracting office will provide task order performance work statements and supporting technical exhibits/workload data for industry comments prior to the RFP release, when the timeline allows.
Step 3 - Technical	Are all 48 large business EAGLE BOA holders considered equal in capability, or are there project-specific requirements in each task order that will make some large BOA holders unqualified for a specific task order?	All BOA Holders received a BOA as a result of an evaluation against specific criteria in the BOA RFP. When BOA Holders compete for task orders, they will be evaluated against the criteria specific to that task order.
Step 3 - Technical	Is the Eagle Contracting Team going to standardize Workload Data across all BOA Task Orders? To date it has been inconsistent and has not used SAMS-E for Annual Maintenance Man-hours by shop Section.	It is the Government's intent to eventually provide Workload Data in a standardized format as appropriate. However, each Task Order is unique and could have exclusive Workload Data specific to the Task Order location.
Step 3 - Technical	What will RICC do to address the amount of knowledge and therefore competitive advantage that an incumbent will have with how many work orders and the man-hours required from specific levels of capability of maintenance personnel? When a non-incumbent tries to guess how many people are required to complete an unknown amount of work then an incumbent has an unfair advantage? A non incumbent may have a much better approach (innovation) then the incumbent but their proposal will be significantly different and much harder to evaluate. What is the RICC doing to address this issue?	Workload data is provided to all BOA Holders, providing the best information that the Government has available. As these are consolidated requirements, the incumbent contractor is not performing the same work scenario as what is expected in EAGLE, therefore, does not possess an unfair advantage due to the fact that they are the incumbent. It is up to each Offeror to propose its best approach IAW the RFP.
Step 3 - Technical	Step 3 Task Order Process - Consider tying the release of the draft PWS with a site visit. Coupled with an opportunity to submit question could reduce time line adjustments required to answer uniformed questions.	The Government is looking at the site visit process and will take the industry recommendations/feedback into consideration to improve this process.
Step 3 - Technical	Would ASC consider giving BOA Holders both FTEs and staff mix (labor categories) on EAGLE Task Order?	This is currently not under consideration.

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Step 3 - Technical	When you send out the draft PWS and workload data you specifically state “no questions”, how are we supposed to get information we need?	As part of the draft RFP's we plan to send out, we will not be answering any questions submitted regarding the draft RFP. Our goal is for you to review the draft documents and provide us feedback on how we can improve the information to provide it in a format that will make your proposal easier to develop. Any improvements or suggestions made on the draft RFP will be considered before a final RFP is issued.
Step 3 - Technical	Shouldn't the PWS for each task order be the same?	We have different sections to capture each overarching requirement. The overarching requirements are fairly standard across the board. There will be different requirements at each local level. We break the PWS down into sections. Section 5 is specific for each installation and provides information as to the activities performed by the specific installation. The number scheme is standardized for ease of reference for industry. We are moving in the direction of having standardized data, but we are not quite there yet. We would appreciate feedback from industry when documents are released.
Step 3 - Technical	In past Task Orders, you disclosed minimum staffing levels, will the Government release these minimum levels in Section L in the future?	We are making changes as we move along this process. We are refining the process, so it is easier to understand and submit. We are going to make a change to the technical factor submission and evaluation requirements, but cannot guarantee it will include minimum staffing levels.
Step 3 - Technical	We need the man hours, work hours, and number of FTEs per labor category. Why don't you give us this information?	Labor categories and man hours are the answer to a work load problem. The workload data is provided, and the the technical evaluation assesses how a contractor intends to organize and staff to accomplish the workload.
Step 3 - Technical	You mentioned earlier the BOE was no good on a past task order, can you provide an example?	The Government requested the BOE in an attempt to gain some insight on how contractors developed their staffing plan. After reviewing BOEs the EBO has determined that the BOE adds no value to the technical evaluation process and will be eliminated from future RFPs.
Step 3 - Technical	The Government provides minimum staffing. They may or may not provide BOE, where does this support innovation?	The minimum staffing is an IGE developed by experts on the mission of the installation requirement/workload. It is our Tech. experts opinion that staffing below this level constitutes an unacceptable risk to the mission. Innovative proposals which fully explain how a contractor can reduce staffing and still accomplish the mission without risk will be evaluated for feasibility.
Step 3 - Technical	If you are providing a minimum staffing level, where is innovation in a proposal considered in the evaluation process?	The minimum staffing is an IGE developed by experts on the mission of the installation requirement/workload. It is our Tech. experts opinion that staffing below this level constitutes an unacceptable risk to the mission. Innovative proposals which fully explain how a contractor can reduce staffing and still accomplish the mission without risk will be evaluated for feasibility.
Step 3 - Technical	The BOE is supposed to explain our methodology in creating our staffing proposal. Are you assessing our ability to develop a staffing solution or just our ability to match the minimum staffing requirement?	The Government requested the BOE in an attempt to gain some insight on how contractors developed their staffing plan. It is up to the BOA Holder to determine which approved teammates it desires to propose for specific task order.
Teaming	Does the EAGLE Contracting Office intend to advise companies listed in the "Approved Subcontractors" paragraph that they have indeed been identified to support a named BOA holder in those functional areas?	The Government has no privity of contract with BOA Holder teammates/subcontractors. Therefore, the Government does not intend to advise companies listed.
Teaming	Can an Offeror subcontract on a case-by-case basis to a new teammate by offering a 20% work share (Major Sub)?	When submitting a proposal in Step 3, a BOA Holder who demonstrated organizational capability without the reliance of teammates in ALL functional areas may propose itself and/or subcontractors not previously approved in Attachment 0002, Team Arrangement. (See BOA Holder Briefing slide # 17 for other scenarios).
Teaming	As a Scenario #1 BOA Holder we can add any subcontractor without "req" (requirement?) for Past Performance because WE have the Past Performance? Teaming	How will I know when my teammate list is approved?	You will know when it is approved because it will be added to your BOA via a modification.
Teaming	How many teammates am I allowed on my BOA?	You are allowed 10 teammates to show organizational capability. During the addition phase, you may add more teammates to enhance your capability.
Teaming	Why is it taking so long to add team members (team approach changes) when that team member is already an approved EAGLE BOA Holder (Prime)?	The timeline associated with processing team member additions/revisions is a very defined process with established steps for completion. The fact that a requested addition is an EAGLE BOA Holder has no bearing on the amount of time that is required to complete the process.
