Command Sgt. Major Bernard P. Smalls Sr., assumed responsibility as the Command Sergeant Major, U.S. Army Expeditionary Contracting Command, on June 22, 2015. He advises the ECC commanding general on all enlisted-related matters as well as areas affecting Soldier and Army civilian quality of life issues.

Headquartered at Redstone Arsenal, AL, ECC is a subordinate command of the Army Contracting Command. It provides effective and agile expeditionary contracting across the full spectrum of military operations for Army service component commands and federal agencies.



A native of Beaufort, SC, CSM Smalls began his Army career in August 1987 at Fort Leonard Wood, MO, for Basic Training and graduated from the Advanced Individual Training in December 1987 as a Motor Transport Operator.
