Mr. Jeffrey L. Caldwell Deputy Executive Director

Mr. Jeffrey L. Caldwell is the Deputy Executive Director for U.S. Army Contracting Command-Redstone Arsenal (ACC-RSA), the largest contracting center of the U.S. Army Contracting Command. He is responsible for assisting the Executive Director with day-to-day operations and oversight of a diverse contract execution mission averaging over \$20 billion annually. Prior to becoming the Deputy Executive Director, Caldwell served as the Deputy Project Manager, Mid-Range Capability for the Rapid Capabilities and Critical Technology Office where he had direct oversight of acquiring and producing \$1.9 billion in Modernization solutions as tasked by the board of directors chaired by the Secretary of the Army. Caldwell has held multiple leadership, command and staff, and acquisition positions over 28 years of honorable service in the U.S. Army and U.S. federal government.



Caldwell's acquisition career began in 2000 after successfully completing the Materiel Acquisition Management Course at Fort Lee, Va. He served overseas as a Contracting Officer with the Combat Equipment Battalion, Camp Doha, Kuwait in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and with the Army Contracting Agency, Doha, Qatar until December 2005. He would later complete both Command and General Staff College, along with Advance Civil Schooling. From June 2007 to June 2008, Caldwell again served overseas as the Brigade Operations Officer with the 408th Contracting Support Brigade (Forward), Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, also supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom. He then served as a Contracting Officer with the United States Army Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg, N.C. Caldwell later deployed as the Chief of Contracting (Forward) for the Special Operations Forces Support Activity and Special Operations Command Central. From June 2010 to May 2013, Caldwell served as a Contracting Officer and Division Chief with the Army Contracting Command-Redstone Arsenal in the Aircraft Weapon System Contracting Directorates supporting both Apache and Cargo Program Offices. From May 2013 to May 2015, Caldwell served as Director, Contracting Center Americas/916th Contracting Battalion, Joint Base San Antonio, Texas, and successfully deploying the organization to Iraq in support of the Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve. Caldwell has also served as the Principal and Deputy Chief of Staff G-3/5/7 for Operations in support of the U.S. Army Contracting Command and Expeditionary Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, Ala. from May 2015 to June 2016. He completed his military career in August 2019 after serving three years as the Director of the Defense Contract Management Agency-Huntsville, Ala., where he was responsible for over \$200 billion of contract administration and oversight for the Department of Defense and U.S. federal government.

Caldwell's civilian and military education includes a Master of Arts Degree in Procurement and Acquisition Management from Florida Institute of Technology, a Master of Science Degree in Strategic Studies from Air University and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Saint Augustine's College. Caldwell is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps and is DAWIA Level III certified in Contracting and Level II certified in Program Management. His military and civilian awards includes the Legion of Merit Award, Army Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, National Defense Service Medal, and the Meritorious Civilian Service Award.
